

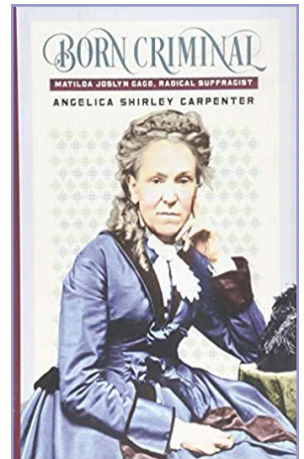
Spring 2019 Visiting Author Series

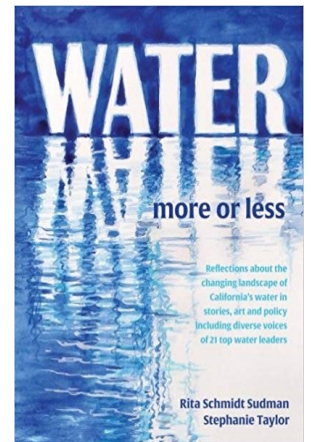

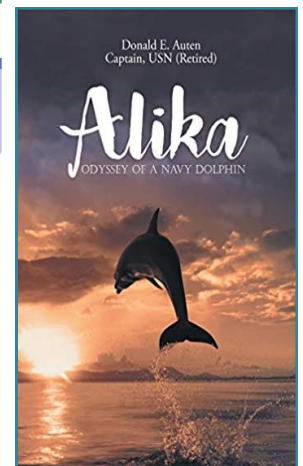

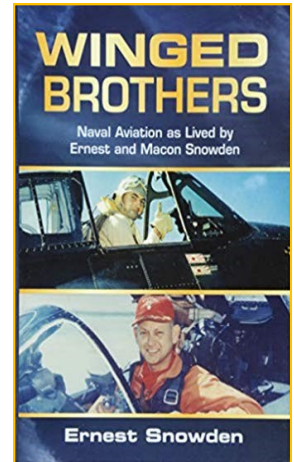

Thursday, April 4th at 6:30pm

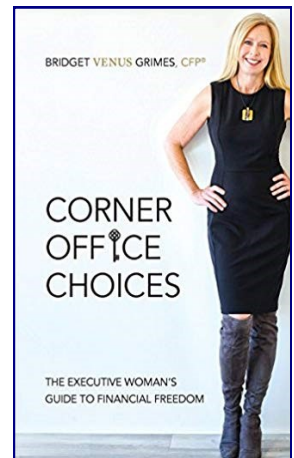

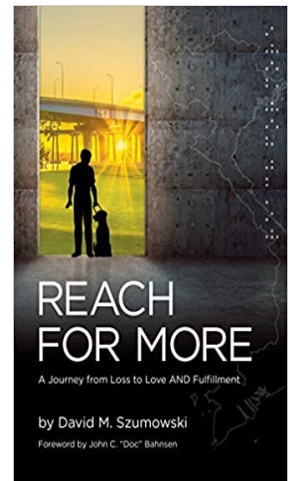


DAVID M. SZUMOWSKI
