

## **Celebrating Coronado Artists**

Coronado and the Cultural Arts Commission encourages the use of public spaces for public art and cultural events. The Orange Avenue Banner Program installs banners throughout the year on Orange Avenue from First Street to Avenida de las Arenas. The banners add vitality and color to the cityscape and promote the community. The program is made possible through a generous grant from Discover Coronado and the program is administered by the Cultural Arts Commission. The Spreckels Gallery located in the John D. Spreckels Center, was established in July 2019 and highlights the artwork of local artists who are 50+ in age. Approximately two exhibitions will be mounted each year in the facility. The first exhibition in the Spreckels

Gallery featured member art from the Coronado Art Association celebrating 70 years in Coronado in 2019.







The C3 Gallery located in the Coronado Community Center, was established in November 2015 during the City of Coronado's 125th Celebration.

The first exhibition was "Visions of Coronado" featuring 25 local artists. Since opening, the gallery has hosted over a dozen exhibitions featuring over 150 artists.

The gallery was underwritten through grants from the City of Coronado, The Coronado Woman's Club, The Coronado Art

Association, and private donations from over 50 donors.

The C3 Gallery exhibitions are a program of the Coronado Cultural Arts Commission (CAC) and fulfills a top priority for the CAC to establish local venues for ongoing art exhibitions by community artists.


